

Motorcycle Rider Instructor Killed by Drunk Driver

(1969-2003)**

Sherri Glover, who had been riding for 13 years, was struck and killed by a driver whose blood alcohol content was 0.36% according to a TBI crime lab report. In 1999, Sherri became a certified Motorcycle Rider Instructor licensed by the State of Tennessee and later taught motorcycle safety classes to over 100 people at Nashville State Tech.

As a member of the Road Angels, Sherri took part in the Pony Express Tour that helped raise money for the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation. Sherri volunteered regularly for many charitable events, and she was scheduled to participate in the Tour de Trace the following Saturday, June 28, to raise money for the Our House residential treatment program for at-risk youth.

Fairview man held in fatality

A Nashville woman was killed Sunday morning on Highway 100 when a man believed to be drunk struck her motorcycle, the Tennessee Highway Patrol reported.

Trooper Gill Smith, who investigated the 10:30 a.m. accident near Fairview, said Sherri A. Glover, 33, of Nashville was riding her Kawasaki Ninja motorcycle westbound on Highway 100. She was struck near the Spencer Mill Road intersection by a 1992 Chevy pickup driven by Jimmy L. Nall, 46, of Fairview, Smith said. Nall was not wearing a seat belt and apparently had been drinking, the officer said.

Nall's pickup, headed eastbound, crossed the center line and hit Glover head-on, Smith said. She was wearing a helmet but died on the scene.

Nall was arrested for vehicular homicide, DUI and violation of the state's open container law. He remains in the Williamson County Criminal Justice Center in lieu of posting \$250,000 bond.

Glover worked at Belmont University as a project manager for the University Marketing and Communications Department. Before that, she worked at Belmont's School of Music and in the Office of Student Affairs.

"We were shocked and saddened to learn of the tragic death of Sherri Glover," said Greg Pillon, Belmont director of communications. "Sherri spent eight years at Belmont working in many areas of the university and touched the lives of faculty, staff and students throughout the Belmont community. She will be greatly missed."

Sheriff says county jail has plenty of room for DUI offenders

FRANKLIN – Nearly 50 people walk through the doors of the Williamson County Courthouse to face drunk driving charges each month. Sheriff Ricky Headley ... announced that police in Brentwood, Franklin, Fairview and Nolensville are joining the Tennessee Highway Patrol and the Williamson County Sheriff's Department in a effort to save lives through tougher DUI enforcement over the July 4th holiday weekend. ...

Headley said he realized the county's law enforcement agencies had to join forces to combat drunk driving after seeing the body of a woman who was killed by a suspected drunk driver.

That woman was Sherri Glover, 33, of Nashville, who was driving her motorcycle along a stretch of Highway 100 near Fairview at approximately 10:35 a.m. on June 22 when she was struck head on by a pickup truck, according to the THP. Glover was killed instantly, her body thrown into a ditch.

"I saw the mangled dead body of a woman in the ditch and the driver of the other vehicle handcuffed in the back of a patrol car, unaware that he had even been in a traffic accident," Headley said. "That made me realize we have to do something."

The driver of the pickup truck was Fairview resident Jimmy Nall, 46, according to the THP. Nall has been charged with DUI, aggravated vehicular assault and driving with an open container. His blood-alcohol level has not yet been determined. ...

Homicide case goes to court

FRANKLIN — The case against a Fairview man accused of vehicular homicide for killing a woman while driving under the influence of alcohol will be presented to a Williamson County grand jury. Jimmy Nall, 46, has been charged with DUI third offense and vehicular homicide. Nall was driving in a pickup truck along Highway 100 near Fairview on the morning of June 22 when he swerved into the opposite lane and struck a woman riding a motorcycle head on, according to the Tennessee Highway Patrol.

A state trooper stated in an incident report that he arrived on the scene around 10:30 a.m. and found Nall passed out in the back of an ambulance. The trooper attempted a field sobriety test but said Nall was too unsteady on his feet to complete the task. A quart bottle of vodka was found in Nall's vehicle and approximately 1/3 of the liquid was gone, said the THP. Nall's blood alcohol content was 0.36%, according to a TBI crime lab report. The legal limit is 0.08%.

Nall has been convicted twice for driving while intoxicated in Davidson County. He is still being held at the Williamson County Jail on \$250,000 bond.
